

Andy Woommavovah is Catholic Health Initiative's (CHI) National Director of Facilities Management and Construction Servicess. Andy has over 26 yrs of experience in facility management and construction that has been gained from a cross section of sectors that includes the United States Army, Civil Works and Health Care. Prior to his current role, Andy spent three years as the Assistant Director of Facilities for CHI and was instrumental in establishing CHI's National Facility Management Program. He led the implementation of a national Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) in all of the CHI managed hospitals (approx. 22.5 million square feet). Other major milestones included establishing key performance indicators that measure CHI hospital performance in energy, compliance, budget performance and work order efficiencies.

Prior to taking the role as assistant director, Andy held roles at CHI's Memorial Health Care System in Chattanooga, Tennessee. His leadership roles at Memorial included Director of Construction Management, Director of Plant Operations and finally Executive Director of Support Services. In his Executive role he led a diverse group of support service providers that included Food and Nutrition, Environmental Services, Security, Clinical Engineering, Construction Management and Facilities & Plant Operations. Prior to his departure from Memorial Andy represented the Facilities group on the startup of a \$380 million dollar Master Facilities Project.

Andy also holds a part time job that he has held for 30 yrs that has taken him to exotic places like Belize, C.A. to build schools as a part of U.S. Nation Building, Honduras, C.A. for road building and design projects, Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom (Iraq Veteran) and his last deployment was to Kuwait in support of Operation Enduring Freedom where he managed facility maintenance and construction operations. Currently in this capacity, Andy is the Equal Opportunity (EO) Program Manager for a U.S. Army Reserve
